Never once did I hear, "we can't hear you back here," as we did every other year in the past. I'd also like to thank Karen McLaughlin for the great job she's done behind the microphone each year. To the many ticket sellers I've had over the years, (unfortunately too many to list individually) and to all the people who have donated prizes over the years, THANK YOU. A special thank you also goes out to John Palmer for his help every year, and not to forget Sue Nuck who also helped me every year, thanks Sue we miss you, you left us way too soon.

I would like to ask you, the general membership, to please help and support Pat and De Anne as you have me for the past 15 years. It's been my pleasure serving you.
