At the October Board meeting we finalized the plans for the November open house meeting. Bruce Blodgett has offered to take care of the snacks. Flyers have been posted about the open house and handed out at the snow show, and we will have special pricing for new memberships that night only.

SAFETY SCHOOL

The Snobirds will again be offering snowmobile safety classes this winter. The classes are conducted by qualified instructors, from the Snobirds, who are certified by the State D.N.R.. Satisfactory completion of the class meets the D.N.R. requirements.

“Any person who is at least 12 years old AND who is born on or after January 1, 1985 is required to possess a *valid Snowmobile Safety Certificate* in order to operate a snowmobile on public trails, lands or frozen waters. You must carry the certificate while riding and you must display it to a law enforcement officer when requested.”

As this training is important to public and personal safety, a parent or guardian is welcome to attend with their student without paying a fee, unless they also wish to be certified. There is a \$10 fee for registration and D.N.R. safety materials. The course consists of three evening classes with subjects of snowmobile laws, ethics, terminology, maintenance, clothing, first aid, environmental and ecology problems.

We have two sets of indoor sessions scheduled this season. Total cost is \$10.00

The first set will be December 5, 12 and 19 at the Menomonee Falls Community Center, W152 N8645 Margaret Rd in Menomonee Falls.

The second set of classes will be on January 9, 16 and 23.

For reservations call Gary Breuckman at 414-442-4279. Classes run from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. each night, and you must attend all three sessions to be certified.

There was a small groomer show, showing off some of the new grooming equipment available this season. Of course the famous hospitality rooms as always! Lots of stories being told of days gone by as well plans for the great snow rides to come.

Then it was off to a dance with a costume contest for some fun and relaxation. Than more hospitality room time or bed for some tired out people.

Saturday started with a early morning meeting, with an update of what AWSC was up to over the last few months. What the officers have been up to. A speaker from the Department of Tourism talked to us about partnerships and how important they are to them as well as us. At the same time the Queen contestants started their quest for the right to represent the AWSC for the next year in another room. Than the all important LUNCH TIME!

David Rowley, of SnoBirds, the winner of the AWSC 2012 Snowmobiler of the Year Award arranged for a luncheon for his friends, club members of Waukesha County, SnoBirds and a few special guests with the help of Bruce Blodgett.

Two Youth workshops, a Wisconsin DNR recertification and update, Social Media, Groomer Tips & Tricks, Trail Maintenance & Signing, Club Reimbursement Funds from the State/ How to do the paperwork and Project & Property Planning with the DNR & DOT. A silent Auction started at 4 P.M. and ran until 9 P.M. with proceeds going to the scholarship funds to benefit deserving snowmobiling youth going on to school to further their education. High school seniors can download an application from the AWSC web page to apply. These are due by February 1, 2013 to the AWSC. Last year over 6,500.00 worth of scholarships were given away.

A banquet was held where all of the year awards were giving out to many deserving people, of important to us was David Rowley being named 2012 AWSC Snowmobiler of the year, with his family and friends in attendance. The current Miss Snowflake gave a farewell address (Emily Bauer) and the NEW Miss Snowflake (Alexus Butler) from Dodge County was crowned. After this it was out to the silent auction/ dance/ and or hospitality rooms.

Sunday morning the AWSC directors met at 8:30 A.M. After which it was head for home. It was a very busy weekend with a lot getting accomplished. It looks like AWSC will be again working to get the Cap/ Step program though the legislature this upcoming season once the new legislatures are in office.

One Day Safety Class

Held at the Milwaukee Snow Show October 13, 2012

SnoBirds put on a 1 day snowmobile safety class in conjunction with the Milwaukee Snow Show. We had 58 students who attended and passed the DNR test allowing them to ride by themselves this winter. This was a 9 hour, all day class conducted by mostly SnoBird instructors. It covers all the basics of snowmobile safety procedures and is required by all riders born after January 1, 1985. Those under the age of 16 are required (classroom) to take a hands on safety class while those older individuals can go on line with the DNR website and take the class there.

Our THANKS to all the instructors who volunteered their time to make this a successful SnoBird venture for the 10th year in a row.
